First Peter Bible Study — I Peter 3:15-19 Lesson #12

****INSTRUCTIONS:** Read the entire section of Scripture in First Peter before starting to look up the other Scripture verses and filling in the blanks. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to give you understanding as you read God’s word.

15-16 But **SANCTIFY the LORD GOD in your HEARTS**, and **always be READY to give a DEFENSE to everyone who ASKS you a REASON for the HOPE that is in you**, with meekness and fear; having a good conscience, that **when they DEFAME you as EVIL-DOERS**, those who revile your good conduct in Christ may be ashamed.

Definition: “SANCTIFY the LORD GOD in your HEARTS” – To “sanctify” or to “hallow” means to make something holy. **GOD is ALREADY HOLY**, whether we “make Him holy” in our hearts or not, but the idea here is that **we put Him FIRST place in our HEARTS and lives**. In Psalm 37, it is called “delighting yourself in the Lord”, which means to make Him your whole reason for joy and happiness. In Revelation 2:4, Jesus says He has “something against” a group of Believers, **because they have “left their first love”, meaning God**. They were a busy church, doing many things for God, but they had gotten so caught up in these THINGS, that they actually **NEGLECTED the One who was supposed to be their whole reason for living - God Himself**.

Definition: “Be READY to give a DEFENSE to everyone who ASKS you a REASON for the HOPE that is in you” – The “hope that is in you” is your **salvation and assurance of eternal life in Jesus Christ**. In witnessing for Christ, and **especially when people ASK you about your faith**, there are times when you can give your personal testimony, but we can’t emphasize enough the importance of using God’s word rather than your own opinions, or any other source. Don’t say things like, “This is what WE believe...” Instead, say, **“This is what the Bible says...”** and then their argument will be with the word of God, not with YOUR opinion. If you don’t know the answer from the Bible right then, tell your friend you will look it up and give them the answer later. Call a pastor or other strong Christian for help in finding the answer to questions you cannot answer. God’s word is alive and powerful (Hebrews 4:12) and is our sword. If we try to talk and argue using OUR words alone, it is like having a weapon and never using it (keeping our sword in its sheath). As for our attitude when witnessing and giving an answer to those who have asked us, **it must be “with meekness and fear”**, which means with a humble attitude

and with reverence and respect.

Definition: “When they DEFAME you as EVIL-DOERS” – There will always be people who hate Christians and try to say evil things about us. **Sometimes it is because they are living sinful lives, and they don’t like to see anyone living a holy, God-fearing life, because it brings them under conviction.** Just don’t give them any “ammunition” by being a wishy-washy so-called Christian and hypocrite. That way, they will have to “eat their own words” when standing before God, as they will then realize you were a true Christian.

Definition: “If it is the WILL of GOD, to SUFFER for doing GOOD” – As is mentioned above, we should live our lives as dedicated Christians, full of the Holy Spirit, and not giving the enemy any reason to speak badly about us. If we suffer persecution anyway, in spite of our good conduct, God will bless us and help us to go through it. **In other words, if we have to suffer for Christ’s sake, let it be for the name of Jesus Christ only, and not because we have done something wrong.**

Definition: “GLORY which shall be REVEALED in us” — When the whole church of Jesus Christ is gathered in heaven, we will receive our rewards at the Judgment Seat of Christ, we will partake of the Marriage Supper of the Lamb, and we will be REVEALED to all of CREATION as being the high point and CULMINATION of God’s grace.

Definition: “Christ also SUFFERED once for SINS, the JUST for the UNJUST” – Jesus is the “Lamb who was slain” and the “Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world”. In the Old Testament, a little innocent animal (usually a lamb) was slain (killed) as a sacrifice for the sins of the people, but now under the New Covenant (New Testament), **our sins are completely TAKEN AWAY (remitted, BORN AWAY) and WASHED AWAY in the BLOOD of JESUS, which He shed upon the cross.** In the Old Testament (under the Old Covenant), their sins were only COVERED TEMPORARILY until **the Messiah, God’s Lamb, would come to SUFFER and DIE and PAY THE PENALTY** for the sins of the world. Every year, they would have the Day of Atonement to remind them that God’s Lamb was not yet come, and **continual sacrifices and sin offerings** during the year. (See Exodus 30:10, Leviticus 16:30). The literal meaning of the word **“atonement” is covering** (“kapporah” in Hebrew, as in Yom Kippur). Now, when we believe in Jesus, and accept His sacrifice on the cross, **our sins are NOT just covered**, they are **REMITTED and TAKEN AWAY COMPLETELY** (REMIT - to release from the guilt or penalty of). Also, the Old Testament sacrifices had to be carried out over and over again, but **Jesus had to SUFFER and DIE ONLY ONCE.** He is the perfectly sinless, righteous and JUST Son of God, and He died for us, the “UNJUST” (unrighteous sinners).

Definition: “Being put to DEATH in the FLESH but made ALIVE by the SPIRIT” – Jesus suffered and died on the cross in His human, physical body (“the flesh”), but His spirit, His eternal existence as the Son of God, never died. **His physical BODY was resurrected on the third day by the POWER of the HOLY SPIRIT.**

Definition: “He went and PREACHED to the SPIRITS in PRISON” – Don’t get all confused and think that Jesus is here giving people a chance to be saved after death. These “spirits in prison” who have been around since the time of Noah, are **demon spirits, and NOT the spirits of human beings. Jesus went into the “Abyss” where these demons are bound in chains, awaiting the final judgment, to DECLARE and SHOW that He was triumphant over them and all of Satan’s hordes (NOT to preach about salvation).** What did these demons do that was so bad that God has them chained up in the Abyss? According to Genesis 6:1-4, they were probably fallen angels (demons) that had sexual relations with human women, creating a half-breed race of men who were exceedingly evil. These demons and the half-demon-half-men they created were responsible for hardening the hearts of all humanity, so that no one believed Noah’s preaching for over a hundred years when he warned about the coming flood and destruction of the earth.
