First Peter Bible Study — I Peter 4:1- 4 Lesson #14

****INSTRUCTIONS:** Read the entire section of Scripture in First Peter before starting to look up the other Scripture verses and filling in the blanks. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to give you understanding as you read God’s word.

1-2 Therefore, since Christ suffered for us in the flesh, **ARM YOURSELVES also with the SAME MIND**, for **he who has SUFFERED in the FLESH has CEASED from SIN**, that he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh for the lusts of men, but **for the WILL of GOD**.

Definition: “ARM YOURSELVES also with the SAME MIND” – This is the SAME THING as PUTTING ON the ARMOR of GOD. Basically, **the ARMOR is the KNOWLEDGE of WHO you are IN CHRIST**. You must **ARM YOURSELF with that knowledge - knowledge of your POSITION IN CHRIST and the KNOWLEDGE that you are a NEW CREATION in Christ Jesus**. In Col. 3:10 & Eph.4:23-24 is it called PUTTING ON the new man (the “new creation” that you are in Christ). The individual pieces of the armor are specific areas where **you NEED to KNOW who you are and what RESOURCES you have AVAILABLE to you in Jesus Christ**. If you do not know WHO YOU ARE as a believer in Jesus Christ, or maybe you’re just shaky on some points, you **MUST** get into the word of God and **RENEW your MIND!** There is no substitute, there is no short cut to renewing our minds with the word of God, and that is why Peter calls it **“ARMING YOURSELVES with the SAME MIND.”**

Definition: “He who has SUFFERED in the FLESH has CEASED from SIN” – This comes after Peter has said, **“Therefore, since Christ suffered for us in the flesh.”** Wherever we see the word

“therefore” it means to look back on what was said before, so we see that Jesus was the ultimate sacrifice **as He SUFFERED according to God’s will in His own HUMAN FLESH**. We, as His followers, as Christians, must also **go through SUFFERING at various times in our lives**, some more than others. **It is that SUFFERING in OUR FLESH, as we go through “VARIOUS TRIALS and TESTINGS”, that can bring us closer to God, and can purify us from certain SINS that we have allowed to still be in our lives.** Just as Jesus’ suffering on the cross brought Him ultimate victory over Satan, our sufferings in this life can help us to draw closer to God, produce godly qualities such as the fruit of the Spirit, and overcome the devil’s work in our lives. Sometimes, our SUFFERING comes because of **“The CHASTENING of the LORD.” Chastening means discipline or correction**, as one would discipline or spank a child in order **to CORRECT the child’s behavior**. Our loving heavenly Father sometimes must take His children **“to the woodshed for a spanking” for our correction** when we are continuing in sin.

Definition: “VARIOUS TRIALS and TESTINGS” — “Testing” means to qualify or prove by way of being put through certain conditions or procedures, in order to determine the quality or character of something. “Trial” means a tryout or experiment to test the quality, value or usefulness of something. Machines and automobiles are put through “stress tests” to TEST and TRY them to make sure there are no problems, and that they stand up under pressure. Sometimes, **God puts US through “stress tests” that may involve SUFFERING** of some kind, to TEST and TRY our faith, and to purge out our SINS and character defects, that we may escape the CORRUPTION that is in the world.

Definition: “Blessed is the man who ENDURES TEMPTATION – The word “temptation” in this context means **testing**, although resisting the temptation to sin can be a part of our testing that God allows in our lives. Usually, these times of “testing” include going through trials, tribulations, SUFFERING, afflictions, and sometimes persecution or sickness. **Even Jesus was tempted by Satan**, but He did not give in to the temptation, so He did not sin in any way. Jesus was the sinless Son of God - He was not being **tested by the devil** because of any sin in His life. There are times when we must go through some kind of testing or trials, the “storms of life” so to speak, but it is not necessarily because there is some sin God is purging out of our lives. **Some testings are just to teach us obedience and to trust in and depend on our Lord no matter what. They are to PREPARE us for SERVICE, a training course or “boot camp”, as we become “soldiers of Christ”.** Even Jesus, God in the flesh, had to be “perfected” **through SUFFERING in order to learn obedience**, because these were things He could not learn in the perfect environment of heaven (see Phil. 2:8).

In regard to these, **they think it STRANGE that you do NOT RUN with THEM in the same flood of DISSIPATION**, speaking evil of you.

Definition: “Spent ENOUGH of our PAST LIFETIME in doing the WILL of the GENTILES” – In this context, “Gentiles” means unbelievers. In other places in Scripture, “Gentiles” means all the people who are not Jews, but here it just means any old unbeliever. Before we came to Christ and started walking in obedience to Him, our lives were spent in “doing the will of unbelievers” and NOT in doing God’s will. Peter says here that **we have WASTED ENOUGH TIME in living in disobedience to God**, and then goes on to name a lot of the evil, sinful things we all used to do and be involved in. In Ephesians 2:1-2, we see how our past lifestyle was actually in accordance with Satan and his system of this wicked world.

Definition: “They think it STRANGE that you do NOT RUN with THEM in the same flood of DISSIPATION” – The “they” are your old UNSAVED friends and relatives, maybe your old drug or drinking buddies. They don’t understand how you can stop doing the old destructive habits, because they don’t understand that you are a NEW CREATION in Christ Jesus. They want you to RUN WITH THEM in all the old ways of DISSIPATION. “DISSIPATION” means “to use up foolishly”, being WASTEFUL, aimless living, “extravagant pursuit of pleasure”, which is NOT a WISE use of our time here on earth. REVELRIES means WILD PARTYING and sexual immoralities, such as orgies.

Definition: “LICENTIOUSNESS” – Not obeying the rules, “lacking or deficient in discipline; without restraint, LAWLESSNESS”; “doing whatever feels good at the time.”

Definition: “SONS of DISOBEDIENCE” – According to Ephesians 2:2, the “sons of disobedience” are UNBELIEVERS; those who are still under Satan’s control, and have not been born again. In Ephesians 2:3 they are also called “children of WRATH.” Since they have NOT accepted God’s way of forgiveness for their sins, they have nothing to look forward to except the WRATH OF GOD and eternity in HELL.

• **John 3:18** “He who believes in Him (Jesus) is NOT _____; but he who does not believe is _____, because he has NOT believed

in the name of the only begotten Son of God.”

Definition: “ABOMINABLE IDOLATRIES” — An ABOMINATION is something that is detestable, DISGUSTING, hateful to God. We know from the Old Testament Scriptures especially, that IDOLATRY is disgusting to God. Whether we make idols of wood, gold or silver, or just putting other things and worldly possessions in place of God, it is all IDOLATRY and SIN in God’s eyes.
