Definition: "As many as are of the WORKS of the LAW are UNDER the CURSE"
 - The New Testament teaches that **we, as Christians, are under GRACE and NOT under the law**, but false teachers in Paul's day and certain groups and "cults" today would have us believe that we must still keep the Law of Moses, and especially the 4th commandment, which is keeping the Sabbath. These false teachers are not "rightly dividing the word of God" and they have not considered a few other issues that are involved. For instance, **if you are going to require adherence to the Ten Commandments, you MUST ALSO KEEP the approximately 600 additional commandments** given to Israel under the Law of Moses. You don't get to pick and choose which commandments you want to keep. God does not give us that option, and **failure to KEEP ALL the LAW was to bring upon yourself the CURSE** and the penalty of DEATH. Some people today want to pick out the weekly 7th day Sabbath, but what about all the other "sabbaths" and holy days, and the Passover, and going to the temple in Jerusalem for these holy days? The Israelites were required to keep ALL the holy days and sabbaths. **Under the New Covenant, God tells us they were ONLY a SHADOW of the REAL THING that was to come, which is JESUS CHRIST HIMSELF.** The temple in Jerusalem was a symbol or "shadow" and God allowed it to be destroyed by the Romans in 70 AD. It was no longer needed, because **WE are now the temple of the living God.** Under the New Covenant, we no longer need a priest, because God says WE are His royal priesthood. We no longer have to observe the Passover, because Christ is our Passover (I Corinthians 5:7). Also, if you are going to put yourself back under the law, **you must accept the DEATH PENALTY and "CURSE" for not keeping the law. The law was an unbearable BONDAGE** that no one could keep, and the penalty for breaking the Sabbath was being stoned to death. We are in Christ, and **Christ has made us free from the curse of the law!**

Definition: "OLDNESS OF THE LETTER" - The Old Covenant, the Old Testament, the "**letter**" referring to the **WRITTEN LAW** given to Moses on TABLETS OF STONE. The penalty for breaking God's law was DEATH.

Definition: "That NO ONE is JUSTIFIED by the LAW in the SIGHT of GOD is evident" - To be justified in the sight of God means that God by His GRACE declares RIGHTEOUS the sinner (you and me) who believes on Jesus Christ. It is **NOT a process of becoming** righteous, it is a **ONE-TIME ACT of GRACE** - we, as sinful people, are MADE RIGHTEOUS the moment we accept Jesus as our Savior! God FORGIVES and FORGETS our SINS, and **JUSTIFICATION means God even FORGETS that we were ever sinners!** There is NO MORE RECORD of our sins. This kind of "justification" before God is **by FAITH alone, plus nothing else. Your works**

will not ADD anything to what Jesus did for you on the cross. If you have placed your FAITH in Jesus Christ to save you, BELIEVING that He PAID for your sins on the cross, you are justified, and **you are "the just" one who is now supposed to LIVE by FAITH.** You do NOT have to work to KEEP yourself saved, because you are already completely saved, and you will never lose it or become unsaved. You cannot earn your salvation by works, and you don't have to work to keep it. The **"working out"** or outward manifestation of the salvation that is already inside you (Phil. 2:12-13), is **growing to Christ-likeness** and having His image formed in you, as you LIVE your life by FAITH.

Definition: "The LAW is NOT of FAITH" - God gave the law, through Moses His servant, to the nation and people of Israel (the Jews) for a specific reason and for a specific period of time (see more of that in the next chapters of Galatians). Moses had brought the Israelites out of Egypt, and there were several million people, **NONE** of whom were spiritually mature or "born again" and having the Holy Spirit, as we Christian believers are today. **In order to keep these people in line and maintain a stable society among them, God gave them over 600 laws to keep**, including what we call the Ten Commandments. There was really no "faith" involved in their keeping God's laws, it was just something they had to do. Let me give you an example: when I'm driving around Los Angeles, **does it take faith** for me to stop at every stop sign and red light? No, **it's just something I know I have to do - a LAW.** If I choose to break that law and disobey it, I find myself "under the curse" of getting a ticket and paying a fine, or going to jail, or maybe both. **FEAR of the CONSEQUENCES of breaking the law is my motivation, NOT FAITH.** It was the same for God's laws with the Israelites, and the consequences of disobeying God's law

was called "the curse" and it is spelled out in detail in Deuteronomy chapter 28. **Living by FAITH** is completely different: **I love God** and want to do the things that are pleasing to Him. **By faith**, I believe and trust Him to work out all the details of situations that I cannot handle on my own. **By faith**, I trust Him for His blessings here on earth and rewards in heaven for my obedience and faithfulness to Him. **By faith**, I trust Him to lead me and guide me when a situation seems impossible. God loves to see that kind of faith coming from His people. Abraham had that kind of faith as he left his home and went out into a far country that he had never seen, and just trusted God.

Definition: "He shall LIVE by them" - The promise of "life" in Leviticus 18:5 is NOT referring to ETERNAL LIFE in heaven, but to the QUALITY of life here on earth. Keeping God's commandments can NEVER EARN us eternal life, but **we would ALL live BETTER LIVES** here in this lifetime if EVERYONE OBEYED even **just the Ten Commandments**. As Christians, under the New Covenant, we are under the "law" of love, which fulfills all the Old Testament commandments.

13. Christ has REDEEMED us FROM the CURSE of the LAW, having become a CURSE FOR us (for it is written, 'Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree'),

Definition: "Christ has REDEEMED us FROM the CURSE of the LAW" - The word here for redeemed was often used to refer to buying a person back out of slavery. On the cross, Jesus paid the price for our sins, and **the resulting curse of eternal death in hell**, and bought us back from that slavery to sin. When it says, **"Having become a CURSE FOR us"** it means **He actually became SIN and a CURSE as He hung on the cross**.
