Definition: "Your DESIRES for PLEASURE that WAR" - We are too quick to blame the devil for our problems many times, **rather than examining ourselves to see what EVIL still LURKS in our own SOULS and in our FLESH - the physical body.** When James speaks about the **"DESIRES for PLEASURE that WAR in your members"** he is speaking about leftovers and hangovers from our old sin nature that still reside in our fleshly body, and in our minds, if we do not renew our minds with the word of God. It is **a constant BATTLE or WAR** to keep the flesh from being in control. Yes, the devil certainly does know our weak points and what "buttons to push" in order to tempt us, and sometimes it is the "fiery darts of the evil one" (Eph. 6:16), and we must extinguish them by putting up the "shield of faith." Other times, it is just that **we are ALLOWING our CARNAL MIND and fleshly emotions to carry us away** (see Isaiah 64:6 - "our iniquities, like the wind, CARRY US AWAY"). Iniquity means **DOING OUR OWN WILL, or GOING OUR OWN WAY** (see Isaiah 53:6). **The way to fight this is to SUBMIT your mind, will and emotions to God, and present your BODY to Him** as a living sacrifice. **The transformation in your life** will come as your mind is renewed with the word of God, and your body is surrendered to the Lord completely.

Definition: "As SOJOURNERS and PILGRIMS, abstain from FLESHLY LUSTS" -
A sojourner is one who is only here for a temporary visit. Pilgrim is a person who travels about; a wanderer. By calling us "sojourners and pilgrims" it means we are not going to be on this earth forever in our fleshly bodies, but are just passing through, on our way to God's eternal kingdom. To "**abstain from FLESHLY LUSTS**" means to **STAY AWAY (abstain) from the sins of the flesh, and the things our old nature liked to do before we were born again.** Is it possible for a Christian to fall back into those old fleshly lusts? Of course it is possible, but **it should NOT be where we LIVE and STAY**, because we are only passing through temporarily, and God has better things for us. If you find you have fallen back into some old sins of the flesh, repent, confess it to God (I John 1:9), and He will cleanse and restore you.

Definition: "MEMBERS" - Individual parts of the BODY, such as HANDS, FEET, TONGUE, EYES, etc. We have the POWER to CHOOSE to let our body parts be used for the glory of God, as **His INSTRUMENTS or TOOLS** of righteousness, or as INSTRUMENTS or TOOLS for sin.

Definition: "You MURDER and COVET" - Jesus makes it clear in Matthew 5:21-22 that **the underlying ATTITUDE of the HEART carries the same guilt as actual murder**, and we know from facts throughout all of history that anger, jealousy, coveting and envy are all prime motives for murder. The very first murder of all human history, that of **Cain killing his brother Abel, was motivated by PRIDE, selfishness and ENVY, which later turned into full-blown anger and murder.** God gave him a chance to repent (Genesis 4:3-8), but Cain refused to come to God in humility by bringing an animal for a blood sacrifice, and instead wanted to "show off" the crops he had grown. Cain was the original one to mirror the words of the song, "**I Did It My Way**"! God refused Cain's sacrifice, but instead of "ruling over" the wrong emotions and passions of his flesh, Cain turned on his brother Abel in ENVY and ANGER, because his brother was obeying God and bringing the correct kind of sacrifice, and murdered him.

Definition: "You ask and DO NOT RECEIVE, because you ask AMISS" - To "ask amiss" means to ask with wrong motives, which in this verse are SELFISH motives - "that you may spend it on your pleasures." **We must pray with RIGHT MOTIVES**, which means not praying with only ourselves in mind. When praying, God looks to see how the answer to your prayer will bring honor and glory to Him, and the furthering of His kingdom. One example of wrong motives in praying might be a wife praying, "Lord, please save my husband, because then he will be a better husband, treat me better, get along with the kids better, and bring home more money." The better motive would be, "God, I want You to save my husband! I pray that he might be all that You want him to be, that he will be the spiritual leader of our household and set a good example for our children, and that **You will be honored and glorified by his life** and the example of obedience he sets." If you aren't sure about your motives, "HUMBLE yourself under the mighty hand of God" and ask Him to change your heart and purify your motives.

Definition: "A FRIEND of the WORLD makes himself an ENEMY of God" - "Enmity" means hostility, being an **enemy**. Why would being a "friend" of this world be so horrible and make you an enemy of God? It is because "The WORLD" in this context refers to the whole system of thinking among the UNSAVED people of the world, who are **under Satan's control. Satan is called "the god of this world"** and the "prince" or "ruler" **OF THIS WORLD**. Satan is also called the "**prince of the power of the air**" - one of the many names for **Satan** in the Bible. We were **motivated** and energized by Satan when we were "children of disobedience", before we were saved. **All unsaved people** belong to **Satan** and are under his control in his "world system".

Definition: "Whose GOD is their BELLY" - "Belly" in this context means "**physical, fleshly appetites**". People make many things their "gods" or "idols" - IDOLATRY doesn't have to be worshiping STATUES, it can be putting ANYTHING ahead of God in our lives. Anything or ANY PERSON in our lives that takes away from **our devotion to God** can become an IDOL .

Definition: "The Spirit who DWELLS in us YEARNS JEALOUSLY" - God came to dwell in you by His Holy Spirit when you accepted Jesus as your Savior, and **He desires "jealously" to be the ONLY GOD in your life**. Exodus 20:3 says, "I am the Lord your God..... You shall have NO OTHER GODS before (besides) Me." We usually think of jealousy as being a bad thing, because our motives are so corrupted by sin, but God can be "a jealous God" in the good sense, because He knows that ONLY HE HIMSELF can truly be a "god" that is good to us. If we allow other things to be our "gods" they will eventually fail us and let us down.
