Definition: "The WORLD of the UNGODLY" - When we speak of the "wicked" or the "evil" people of this world, it's easy to only think of the Adolph Hitlers, the Saddam Husseins, the serial killers, child molesters and rapists, or those who cheat old people out of their homes and life savings. We forget that **God sees EVERYONE as UNGODLY until they come to faith in His Son Jesus Christ for salvation** and new birth. Once we come to Christ in simple faith, we become "the righteous" ones that the Bible talks about. It is not our own righteousness, but the righteousness of Jesus Christ which is applied (imputed) to our bankrupt moral account.

Definition: "Turning the cities of SODOM and GOMORRAH into ashes" - If you are familiar with what happened to the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah, you remember that God caused fire to rain down from heaven, and the cities were completely destroyed. This was God's judgment for their sexual sin and degradation.

- **Genesis 19:24-25** "Then the Lord _____ brimstone and _____ on _____ and _____, from the Lord out of the heavens. So He overthrew (destroyed) those _____, all the plain, all the inhabitants of the cities, and what grew on the ground."

Definition: "The FILTHY CONDUCT of the WICKED" - The "filthy conduct of the wicked" that is referred to here and also in Judges 19:20-23 is homosexuality, and more specifically gang rape of the strangers that have come to their city. **The expression "know them carnally" means to have sex with them. These men are so depraved and perverted that they look upon any stranger as "fresh meat" for their sexual immorality and lusts.** In both the situation in Genesis and in Judges, it was unsafe for men to sleep in the open square of the city, because they would be sexually molested and raped by the homosexual men of the city. God's word is very clear on the subject of homosexuality, and it is a sin. God does not cause anyone to "be born that way", but rather it is a sexual addiction, and can be overcome by the power of God, just as any other addiction, such as alcoholism or drug addiction. The words "fornication" and "adultery" in the Bible, or the newer translations say "sexual immorality", means **ANY sexual intercourse other than between a man and woman who are MARRIED to each other.** Lot was just as wrong to offer the men his virgin daughters instead of the men who were his guests, but it just shows how horrible a sin Lot considered these homosexual men to be attempting.

According to God's Word, homosexuality is an unnatural condition (Romans 1:27). It is listed with various other sins which are all destructive to human personality, and as such are opposed by God. The Bible says that God will forgive all who confess their sins and turn to Christ, but indicates that those who willfully and continually practice sexual immorality, idolatry, adultery, homosexuality, stealing, greed, drunkenness, slandering, and swindling, and do not turn to Christ for salvation, will not inherit the kingdom of God (1 Corinthians 6:9-11). The reason God is opposed to these actions (and all other sins) is because they are harmful to those whom he loves--us. It has never been proven that homosexuality is in one's genes any more than pedophilia is. And if they are, perhaps sin, too, is in our genes because we are born with a sin nature. But that does not justify sinful acts. In fact, there are usually deep psychological causes behind many of these external "acts of sin." The causes often have their roots in the past and need to be confronted if a person is to find wholeness--emotional and spiritual healing, and recovery. Often it is a failure to receive love in early childhood that "drives" people into some acts of sin. Only love, Christ's unconditional love through us, will ever reach these people and keep them from God's wrath against sin.

Definition: "DELIVERED RIGHTEOUS LOT" - Lot was the nephew of Abraham. He was a believer in the one, true God, and therefore was considered by God to be "righteous" and is called "righteous Lot" in spite of the mistakes he made and the sins he had in his life. Today, for us as New Testament believers in Jesus Christ, our righteousness is imputed (given) to us when we receive Jesus as our Lord and Savior, and God also considers us righteous, no matter what sins we have committed. Our sins are not only forgiven, but God does not hold them against us, but looks upon us as righteous, because we are believers in His Son Jesus Christ.
