Here's a little Bible study from the book of Ephesians that should make your day, if you weren't already jumping for joy and blessed in the Lord today. Ephesians 1:5-7 says, "Having predestined us to adoption as sons (children) by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will, to the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He has MADE US ACCEPTED in the Beloved (Jesus, His beloved Son). In Him we have REDEMPTION through His BLOOD, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace." We wanted to look closer at the term "accepted in the Beloved." The Beloved is Jesus, God's beloved Son, of course. When you receive Jesus as your Lord and Savior, you are placed into Christ, the Beloved One. You are now "accepted" by God the Father because of your relationship to Jesus. However, the word "accepted" means much more than what we think of it sometimes. You might say, "Oh, yes, they accepted me into their group", but were they just allowing you to come in, or were they really welcoming you and overjoyed that you are now a part of their group? In the Bible, this word "accepted" means HIGHLY FAVORED and HONORED with BLESSINGS. That is so much more than just being ALLOWED to enter God's presence or His kingdom. He has welcomed us and showered us with blessings and His GRACE and FAVOR. Isn't that wonderful? Also, don't forget that these verses above say that "He has MADE us ACCEPTED" in Christ. God did it, not we ourselves. We are not worthy of God's favor and blessings, and we cannot clean up our lives and try to EARN His God Himself has to MAKE us worthy and ACCEPTED and righteous through Jesus Christ.

Monthly Evangelistic Outreach to Venice Beach

Saturday, January 6, 2024 - We had three teams that went out to different places, and they were all some of our regulars: Tom, me, Kaela, Laura, Felipe, Ricardo, Sheldon and Ulysses. We had 180 lunches, hygiene/toiletry packets, socks, used clothing, jackets and coats, and blankets for the homeless, and also dog food for any homeless person that had a dog. Sheldon and I went up to the north end of the Venice Boardwalk, and Kaela and Laura went to the south end of the Boardwalk. Felipe, Ricardo and Ulysses went to the homeless encampments in Santa Monica under the freeway overpass, to a group of people living in their motorhomes in Venice, and other locations in Venice, and to some people who were living in tents in West Los Angeles. Felipe said they "gave out absolutely everything" and had a great time. Felipe looked for homeless people in so many different areas, it reminded us of the Scripture where Jesus said, "Go out into the highways and hedges and compel them to come in (meaning into His kingdom), that My house may be filled." Sheldon and I gave a blanket, a large tote-bag-on-wheels, a lunch and some clothing to a man named Matthew, and he just couldn't stop saying "Thank you, thank you." A man named Michael took a lunch, toiletries, and several warm pieces of clothing, and he was very grateful. A young woman who said her name was Nafi took a lunch, several items of clothing and toiletries, and gave us a big smile. We offered a pair of jeans to another woman, and she said she would go to the restroom and try them on. We saw her coming out of the restroom, and she was wearing them. We asked one man if he could wear a pair of size 11½ shoes, and he was so thrilled, and said, "Yes! I

can never find size 11-and-a-half - this is great!" Brian was sitting on a bench, and he was so thankful to receive a lunch, toiletries, and some clothing. Every person who received food and clothing was very happy, and the warm jackets and blankets were especially appreciated in the cold weather. We saw 88-year-old Jean, who lives in her van, and she was as cheerful as ever and said she's always praying for us. The men at the Phoenix House were outside on a break, and they were watching us give food and clothing to the homeless people across the way from them. They're not supposed to take anything from outsiders, so we gave a bunch of gospel tracts to their supervisor. He said, "Are these about Jesus?" and we said, "Yes." He said, "Great! I will give them to all the guys here." Kaela and Laura gave out all the clothing, dog food, and all but a few of the lunches, which they took home to give out during the next few weeks. Kaela said the people who received coats and blankets were very happy, and one man got a blanket for his two dogs. We also handed out gospel tracts to people walking along the Boardwalk, mostly in English, but some in Spanish.

Saturday, February 3, 2024 - Our ministry teams today consisted of Tom, me, Kaela, Laura, Jasmine, Sheldon, Felipe, Ulysses, David, Keith, and Jose. Ricardo was going to come, but Felipe said he'd had a slight stroke, so wasn't up to it (he's okay now). Tom stayed home and kept us all covered in prayer. We had 182 lunches, lots of hygiene/toiletry packets, socks, used clothing, jackets and sweatshirts, knit hats (made with love by my friend Debbie) and shoes for the homeless, and also dog food for any homeless person that had a dog. It had been raining a lot, but the forecast for today was only for rain in the later part of the day. Thank You, Jesus! Several of the homeless people we saw told us they are in shelters now, but were just down at the Boardwalk for the day, but most of them are still out in the cold and rain. Keith, Sheldon and I went to the north part of the Venice Boardwalk, Kaela, Laura and Jasmine went to the south part of the Boardwalk, and Felipe, David, Ulysses, and Jose went to the homeless encampments under various freeway overpasses around West L.A, and Santa Monica, to some people living in their motor homes, and ended up in Lincoln Park in Santa Monica. Everyone seemed to be genuinely thankful and grateful for the food, clothing and other things. The shoes were very much appreciated, and we gave out almost all of the clothing. An older man named Roy got a lunch, and then I asked him if he needed any clothes. He was very happy to get a T-shirt and some pants. Another man named Joshua got a lunch, toiletries, socks, and some shoes. These are just a few examples, and we got lots of big smiles from those who were recipients of all the food and clothing we gave out. One man kept saying, "Thank you for doing this," and we told him we were doing it in the name of Jesus. We also gave out all the dog food. We handed out gospel tracts in English and Spanish, and there is also a gospel tract in each lunch. One man, when he saw me giving a tract in Spanish to another man, came up and asked for one in Spanish for himself. I gave a little tract to a young man who said his name was Chris. He was not homeless, and he asked me what the booklet was about. I said, "it's about Jesus." but in a comic book format." He said, "Jesus, as in Christian?" I said, "Yes, Christian, born-again, Jesus," and he said, "Oh, good! I'm a new believer, and the Lord has done many miracles in my life." He proceeded to tell us how Jesus helped him get sober, and he now had two years' sobriety. I gave him one of our tracts with our ministry information on the back, and told him to look up our website, because we have a Christian 12-Step program. Sheldon talked to a couple for guite a while, because the young lady said she wanted to be baptized. He invited them to his church, and said they could talk to the pastor there about being baptized. We also gave out a bunch of tracts to the supervisor at the Phoenix House, and he said he would give them to the men living there in the program. group saw a lot of their "regulars" and they all had a good time. It was Jasmine's first time, and she really enjoyed it. Felipe said his group gave out all their lunches and clothing, and said it was, "Fabulous!" Felipe also had some boxes of canned food from the local food bank, and he said the people living in tents and motor homes do have can openers. Keith, Sheldon and I had a few lunches left after going down half of the Boardwalk, so we drove up Rose Avenue to the Whole Foods Store up at Rose and Lincoln, where there are a lot of people living in tents on the sidewalk. They were all very happy to see us and get lunches and food for their dogs, too. All in all, we had a great time doing the

Lord's work. Serving the Lord shouldn't be drudgery, and it is a lot of fun for all of us.

Saturday, March 2, 2024 - The volunteers who came to help Tom and me were Kaela, Johnny, Lalo, Jacob, Felipe, Ulysses, David, Keith, and Jose. It was raining right before we left to go down to the Boardwalk, and stopped for a while, but later was raining lightly while we were down there giving out the lunches. We had prayed for the Lord to stop the rain altogether, but as we were giving out everything to the homeless, it seemed as if they were even more appreciative that we had come out in the rain to help them, so we just praised the Lord that He had a better plan. Keith, Lalo and I went to the north part of the Venice Boardwalk, Kaela, Johnny and Jacob went to the south part of the Boardwalk, and Felipe, David, Ulysses, and Jose went to the homeless encampments under some of the freeway overpasses around West L.A, and Santa Monica, and to some people living in tents along the streets. We had 180 lunches, lots of socks, shoes, used clothing, hygiene/toiletry packets, and knit hats for the homeless, and dog food for the homeless people who have dogs. We saw 88-year-old Jean, who lives in her van, and a few other people we recognized, but mostly new people. A woman named Areceli ("Sally" for short) got a lunch, toiletries, and some clothing, and she was very thankful. The people who received the shoes were especially happy, and the jackets and T-shirts were popular items, too. One homeless man said his name was River Phoenix, and told us he'd starred in several movies. Well, we knew that wasn't true, but that was the fantasy world he was living in. He was very glad to get a lunch. Felipe said his group was giving away food and clothing to whatever people they found in need on the streets. The rain was off and on, and Felipe said, "We are now wetback people. Our backs are wet from the rain, and everything is going great!" Felipe also said that David saw an elderly man outside of a restaurant and lying on the ground, unable to walk, and he offered him a lunch. We had a few lunches left over, because of the rain (not as many people down at the Boardwalk), so we each took a few, and will give them out to homeless people we see during the week. There is a gospel tract in every lunch, and we also gave out a few tracts to people who were just down at the Boardwalk. I gave gospel tracts in Russian to two elderly Russian women. So, the rain did not stop us from doing God's work, praise the Lord!
