Definition: "Judgment is WITHOUT MERCY to the one who has shown NO MERCY" - We are told in God's word not to judge one another by outward appearances, and not to be judgmental (showing no mercy) on others when we have sin in our own lives. When we have sin in our lives, we sure want OTHERS to have mercy and compassion on US, and "give us a break"! "Mercy triumphs over judgment" means both our own showing mercy and compassion to others, and God showing mercy to us. Jesus said, 'With the same measure you use, it will be measured to you,' so show mercy to others by not being critical and judgmental, and not only they, but God Himself will show mercy to you! This also has implications in regards to our ETERNAL JUDGMENT, because when a person shows no mercy or compassion to others, it may indicate that he or she has never responded to the mercy of God by believing in Jesus Christ. In this sense, "Mercy triumphs over judgment" would mean that the one who is SAVED by faith in Jesus Christ is READY for the Judgment Day, because Christ has taken our judgment upon Himself on the cross, and been judged for us.

Definition: "Has FAITH but does not have WORKS" - The Bible tells us over and over again that we are SAVED by GRACE through FAITH, as a FREE GIFT from God, and not by the WORKS of the law. However, "works" in the context of James 2:14 26 means EVIDENCE that your faith in Christ is REAL. **TRUE FAITH will always** have corresponding action. In James 2:14-26, there is a warning to beware of those who are just "full of hot air" and show no real change in their lives or have anything to show for their supposed faith in Christ. A person who has asked God to take control of their life and Jesus to come into their heart SHOULD start acting like Jesus, even if only in small ways at first. A new Believer, of course, wouldn't have as many "works" as someone who has been saved a long time, but **they should have** some EVIDENCE or PROOF in their life that indicate their faith is real. A hunger for God's word, a desire to please Him and obey Him whenever they find out something in their life is not right, a desire to fellowship with God's people, and a concern that friends and family members come to know Christ - all of these things are **just a few of the evidences** that a person should have if their faith is real. Some other Scriptures call it FRUIT (John 15:1 8, Galatians 5:22 23) rather than WORKS, but in this context they mean the same thing.

Definition: "Can FAITH SAVE him?" - Another way to say this would be, "Can FAITH alone SAVE him?" or "Can this kind of FAITH SAVE him?" True saving faith will ALWAYS have "works" or "fruit" (corresponding actions) to go along with it. As Christians, our words must be matched by our deeds.

Definition: "If a BROTHER or SISTER is NAKED and destitute of daily FOOD" -"Destitute of daily food" means not having enough to eat. "Brother or sister" means our brothers and sisters in Christ - other Christians. Jesus said in Matthew 25:34-40 that if we feed and clothe our brothers and sisters in Christ, we are doing it to Jesus Himself.

Definition: "FAITH by itself, if it does not have WORKS, is dead" - Again, the "works" spoken of here are evidences that a person's faith is real! Also, the works referred to here are not the works of the law, as in the Old Testament, but are**the WORKS of LOVE from the commandments of Jesus** in the New Testament. It does no good to just say to someone, "I LOVE you and care about you," but you do nothing to help meet their physical needs with food, clothing, warm blankets, etc.

Definition: "Even the DEMONS BELIEVE - and TREMBLE!" - James is a warning against just having "intellectual assent" rather than FAITH. James 2:19 says, "You believe that there is one God. You do well. Even the demons believe - and tremble!" You see, just believing in the existence of God is not enough. The demons believe that Jesus is the Christ, and they know who He is. In Mark 1:23 26 and Matthew 8:28-29, the demons cried out to Jesus, "I know who You are, the Holy One of God!" Intellectual BELIEF would also be like saying, "I believe George Washington was the first president of the United States." That would be a true statement, but it isn't Biblical FAITH. Bible faith, the kind of faith necessary for salvation, means to put your whole life in God's hands, and to TRUST in Jesus with your whole heart. It also means believing that Jesus died on the cross and shed His precious BLOOD to PAY for your sins. The demons have NOT put their faith and trust in Jesus - they just have knowledge of who He is. They also "tremble" in fear of Him, because they know it is Jesus who will throw them into the Lake of Fire at the great Judgment Day.

Definition: "I will SHOW you my FAITH BY my WORKS" - There is a popular saying that goes, "If you were arrested for being a Christian, would there be enough **evidence** to convict you?" Do people know there is something different about you now that you are a Christian, or do you act just the same as you always did? St. Francis of Assisi said, "Preach the gospel always, and when necessary, use words." We are talking about the kind of witness we have before non-believers. Do they see Christ in us, or at least see us on our way and in the process of being changed and transformed? Philippians 2:12-13 says our salvation must be "WORKED OUT" so that it can be seen on the outside. Jesus said in Matthew 5:16 that our good WORKS would be SEEN by men, and because of them, it would cause men to glorify God. In John 15:8, Jesus said the Father would be glorified by our producing MUCH FRUIT, which is another way to refer to our good works.
