Definition: "ESTABLISH your HEARTS, for the COMING of the LORD is AT HAND" - We need to "establish our hearts" or in other words, be strong in our faith and right in our walk with the Lord, because Jesus is coming back soon (that is what is meant by "the coming of the Lord is at hand"). Jesus preached a great deal about His RETURN or "Second Coming." The Bible teaches us that we can know and understand the EVENTS LEADING up to His return, but that NO ONE will know the EXACT day or time (Matthew, chapters 24 & 25, Luke 17:20-37). His FIRST COMING was when He came as a baby in the manger of Bethlehem, and later, as a man, the God Man, to give His life for our sins on the cross. The 300 prophecies in the Old Testament concerning His first coming are scattered throughout the Scriptures, like precious gems that God gave to His people to collect and put together into a beautiful picture of Who the Messiah would be. There are about 500 prophecies concerning His Second Coming, and they are presented in the same way scattered throughout both the Old and New Testaments. We should always use Scripture to compare and explain Scripture, so as we put together the prophecies of Jesus' return, we come up with a picture of what will happen, and approximately when it will happen.

Definition: "The FARMER waits for the PRECIOUS FRUIT of the EARTH" - The "farmer" is God the Father (see John 15:1), and **He is waiting patiently for His harvest**. The harvest represents the return of Jesus Christ and **the final judgment of the earth**. Jesus gave us a description of this final harvest when His disciples asked Him to explain a parable in Matthew 13 - "The Parable of the Wheat and the Tares." We don't have to wonder what this parable means, because Jesus Himself told us what each thing represents in the parable. Jesus said "The HARVEST is the END **of the AGE"** (Matthew 13:39) "....His disciples came to Him, saying, 'Explain to us the parable of the tares of the field.' He answered and said to them, 'He who sows the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world, the good seeds are the sons **of the kingdom**, but the TARES are the sons of the wicked one. The enemy who sowed them is the DEVIL, the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are the ANGELS."

Definition: "TARES" - "Tares" are a weed-like plant that LOOKS exactly like wheat, but of course does not have the wheat kernel, so therefore it is of no value. Jesus used "tares" as an example of people who would **APPEAR on the OUTSIDE to be saved**, and members of His kingdom, but would actually be empty and false. We have Jesus' own words that there will be **many so-called Christians in the church who are NOT God's people** and **have NEVER BEEN God's people** - they belong to the devil all along! These are the ones who may clean up their lives temporarily, but they continually fall back into sin, because they have never had a new birth and a heart-change. These are the ones who are MISTAKEN by many to be Christians who have "lost their salvation" and turned their backs on Christ. **These are the ones who** "cause the Way of Truth to be blasphemed" (II Peter 2:2), because they CLAIM to

be Christians, yet do not ACT like Christians, and so others judge the church by them, and say, "The church is full of hypocrites!"

Definition: "LEST you also UPROOT the WHEAT with them" - Lest means "for fear that" something might happen. So **God does not immediately uproot the tares** for fear that some of the wheat might be uprooted or damaged in the process. Many Christians ("the wheat") are still babies, or are still so immature and unlearned in the word of God (even though they SHOULD be mature) that they would not understand, even to the point of seriously damaging their faith, if God suddenly sent judgment on a number of people in their congregation who were supposedly "good Christians." Instead, God expects us all to grow and mature, and to **STUDY His word**, so that we will have our senses exercised **to DISCERN between the GOOD and the EVIL**.

Definition: "Do not GRUMBLE against one another" - In Philippians 2:14-15, where it says, "Do all things without murmuring and disputing", it could also be translated, "Do all things without GRUMBLING and COMPLAINING." God's word says here that we will "shine as lights in the world" if we keep from grumbling and complaining like the rest of the world. Instead of "GRUMBLING and COMPLAINING

against one another" in the church, we are to forgive each other, just as God in Christ forgives us.

Definition: "The Judge is STANDING at the DOOR!" - Jesus came as our Savior the first time, but His second coming will be as Judge, to judge the world. We, as true believers in Christ, will not be judged, because our judgment has already fallen on Jesus Christ on the cross, and He took our judgment upon Himself and paid for our sins. A favorite verse we quote when talking about receiving Christ as Savior is Revelation 3:20, but if you read it in context, it is actually talking about**His judging the Seven Churches of Asia, and judging between the true believers and the false** within the churches. Jesus calls the true Believers to come in and dine with Him before He judges the false, so-called "believers."

Definition: "The Father JUDGES NO ONE" - Both Old Testament and New Testament speak about God's JUDGMENT of sin and this evil world, but we are told that God the Father has actually **COMMITTED ALL JUDGMENT to the Son, Jesus Christ**. Those who try to say they believe in God and serve God in SOME OTHER WAY other than through Jesus Christ, will have to **be JUDGED by the very One they rejected**! John 5:23 says that if they do not **HONOR the Son in the SAME WAY they HONOR the Father**, they are NOT honoring or worshiping the Father at all! Jesus said in John 14:6 that NO ONE can come to God the Father any other way but through Him.
