John 1:15 -27

15. John bore witness of Him and cried out, saying, "This was He of whom I said, 'He who comes after me is **PREFERRED before me**.'"

Colossians 1:15-18 "He is the ______ of the invisible God, the ______ over all creation. For by ______ all things were ______ that are in heaven and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were ______ through Him and _____ Him. And He is ______ all things, and in Him all things consist (hold together). And He is the ______ of the body, the church, who is the beginning (origin, source), the ______ from the ______, that in all things He may have the preeminence (first place)."

Definition: "He is PREFERRED before me" - Literal meaning is "He ranks higher than I." Jesus is to have the **PREEMINENCE** (having paramount or HIGHEST rank, dignity and importance) ABOVE ANYONE and EVERYTHING. He is NOT just a good man or another prophet.

Read John 8:51-59 (Verses 53-54) "Are You ______ than our father Abraham, who is dead? And the prophets are dead. ______ do You make Yourself out to _____? Jesus answered, 'If I honor Myself, My honor is nothing. It is My Father who ______ Me, of whom you say that He is your God." (Verse 58) "Jesus said to them, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM.'"

Definition: "**BEFORE Abraham was, I AM**" - "**I AM**" was the name of God given to those under the Old Covenant (Old Testament). It simply means He has no beginning or end, but has ALWAYS EXISTED. When God appeared to Moses in the burning bush (Exodus 3:14) He said, "Tell them '**I AM**' has sent you." When the Jews heard Jesus use this term for Himself, THEY KNEW EXACTLY WHAT HE MEANT BY IT, and they picked up stones to stone Him to death, because He was saying He was God! In trying to translate into English, this name is sometimes referred to as "Jehovah" or "Yahweh." We don't really know how it was spoken by the Hebrews, because they thought God's name was too holy to speak or write, but **IT IS NOT NECESSARY for us to know it**. The **name that is GIVEN TO US** is the **NAME OF JESUS** (see Acts 4:12), and Jesus revealed God to us in the New Covenant (New Testament) as "**the Father**."

16-17. And of His FULNESS we have all received, and grace for grace. For the LAW was given through Moses, but GRACE and truth came through Jesus Christ.

Definition: "**GRACE for GRACE**" - This is an expression used to show the GREATNESS and ABUNDANCE of God's grace.

- Ephesians 2:8-9 "For by _____ you have been saved through _____, and that not of _____, it is the _____ of God; not of _____ lest anyone should boast."
- Romans 5:15 "But the FREE GIFT is not like the offense. For if by the one man's offense many died, much ______ the _____ of God and the gift by the ______ of the one Man, ______ abounded to many."

Definition: "Of HIS FULNESS" - We now have the COMPLETE and FULL **REVELATION** OF GOD, and who He is. All through the Old Testament, they only had a GRADUAL REVELATION of God, but it has now come to a climax and completion of the revelation IN THE PERSON OF JESUS CHRIST.

- Colossians 2:9 "For In Him (Jesus Christ) dwells _____ the _____ of the _____ bodily, and you are complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power."
- Ephesians 3:17-19 "That _____ may dwell in your hearts through faith, that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to ______ with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you may be ______ with all the ______ of God."

18. No one has SEEN GOD at any time. The only begotten Son, who is in the bosom of the Father, He has declared Him.

• John 17:6 "I have manifested (declared, REVEALED) Your ______ to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word."

Definition: "IN THE BOSOM of the Father" - This is an expression of the closeness and intimacy that Jesus has ALWAYS HAD with the Father. This verse also says Jesus IS (present tense) "In the bosom of" the Father, which indicates the OMNIPRESENCE OF JESUS as GOD THE SON. He could be here on earth in a physical body, and STILL BE PRESENT WITH THE FATHER in heaven at the same time.

John 5:17-23 "But Jesus answered them, 'My _______ has been working until now, and I have been working.' Therefore the Jews sought all the more to ______ Him, because He not only broke the Sabbath, but also said that ______ was His ______, making Himself _______ with God. Then Jesus answered and said to them, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, the ______ can do nothing of Himself, but what He _______ the ______ do; for whatever He does, the Son also does in like manner. For the Father loves the Son, and ______ Him all things that He Himself does; and He will show Him greater works than these, that you may marvel." (Verse 23) "That all should ______ the ______ just as they ______ the Father. He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who _______ the Him."

Definition: "No one has SEEN GOD" - No one has ever actually seen God in His divine ESSENCE or FACE TO FACE. In the Old Testament, a few people "saw God," but it was either a VISION of God on His throne (see Ezekiel 1:1 & 1:26-28, Isaiah 6:1-6, Daniel 7:9-14), or they saw a PORTION of God's glory as Moses did (see Exodus 33:17-23), or they saw the pre-incarnate Jesus, as did Abraham, who saw the Lord in appearance as a man (see Genesis 18:1-22. The other "two men" were angels - see Gen. 19:1). We, as sinful beings, cannot stand in God's presence, we would be

burned up in an instant by His glory. Only by **BEING BORN of the SPIRIT** are we **recreated into a being** who will be able to be in God's very PRESENCE for all eternity.

Definition: "the ONLY BEGOTTEN SON" - Jesus is the only begotten Son, or UNIQUE, one-of-a-kind Son of God, in that He is the EXACT IMAGE of God, and that He existed in this SON RELATIONSHIP with the Father for all eternity. No one else can become a son of God in the same sense as Jesus (JESUS IS GOD in the FLESH), but we can become sons and daughters of God, and be born into His family BY FAITH in Jesus Christ (John 1:12).

19-20. Now this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?", he confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ." And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah? He said, "I am not" "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "NO."

Definition: "Are you Elijah? Are you the Prophet?" - The Pharisees and Jewish leaders thought that these were two separate people who would come announcing the coming of the Messiah. Actually, "the Prophet" in Deuteronomy is the Messiah Himself (see Matthew 17:5).

Deuteronomy 18:15 & 18-19 "The Lord your God will ______ up for you a ______ like me from your midst, from your brethren (the Jewish people). Him you shall hear (listen to)." "I will raise up for them a _______ like you from among their ______, and will put My words in His mouth, and He shall speak to them all that I command Him. And it shall be that whoever will not hear My words, which He ______ in My _____, I will require it of him."

***The Father said this about Jesus:

- Matthew 17:5 "While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them; and suddenly a ______ came out of the cloud, saying, 'This is My beloved ______ in whom I am well pleased. Him!'"

- Malachi 3:1 "Behold, I send My ______, and he will ______, the way before Me. And the ______, whom you seek, will suddenly come to His temple, even the Messenger of the covenant, in whom you delight. Behold, He is ______, " says the Lord of hosts.

24-25. Now those who were sent were from the Pharisees. And they asked him, saying, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?"

Luke 3:3 "And he went into all the region around the Jordan [River], preaching a
 ______ of ______ for the remission of ______."

Definition: "Why then do you BAPTIZE?" - John's baptism was a baptism of REPENTANCE ONLY, preparing the way for Christ (the Messiah). It is NOT the same as Christian baptism which we do now. In the following section in Acts, Apollos and the disciples in Ephesus were NOT YET SAVED, as they had **ONLY received the baptism of John**, and had not yet heard the gospel and believed in Jesus.

• Read Acts 18:25-28, 19:1-5 (Verses 19:3-4) "And he said to them, 'Into what then were you _____?' So they said, 'Into _____ baptism.' Then Paul said, 'John indeed ______ with a baptism of ______, saying to the people that they should ______ on _____ who would come after him, that is, on ______ .'"

26-27. John answered them, saying, "I baptize with water, but there stands One among you whom you do not know. It is He who, coming after me, is preferred before me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose."

 Read Matthew 3:1-6 (Verses 5-6) "Then [the people of] Jerusalem, all Judea, and all the region around the Jordan went out to ______ and were ______ by him in the Jordan, ______ their _____."

Definition: "whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose" - John here shows his HUMILITY. To unloose someone's sandals was the job of a SERVANT. John makes NO CLAIM to being the Messiah, but just says he is **the humble FORERUNNER of Him**.

Definition: "There stands One AMONG YOU" - The timing of John's gospel is different from Matthew, Mark or Luke. John begins with the ministry of Jesus AFTER He had already returned from His forty days in the wilderness. He says that Jesus is STANDING AMONG THEM, and they DO NOT KNOW HIM, because Jesus had not yet started His preaching and ministry. Not only does John leave out the birth of Jesus from his gospel account, but he leaves out Jesus' own baptism by John the Baptist (see Luke 3:21-22), and Jesus' time of testing by Satan (see Matthew 4:1-11, Mark 1:12-13, Luke 4:1-13).
