John 1:37-51

37-40. The **two disciples** heard him speak, and they followed Jesus. Then Jesus turned, and seeing them following, said to them, "What do you seek?" They said to Him, **"Rabbi" (which is to say, when translated, Teacher)**, "where are You staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where He was staying, and remained with Him that day (now it was about the tenth hour). **One of the two** who heard John speak, and followed Him, was **Andrew, Simon ' Peter's brother**.

 Matthew 4:18 "Now Jesus, walking by the sea of Galilee, saw two brothers, ______ called Peter, and ______ his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen."

Definition: "Two DISCIPLES" - Disciple means a "learner" or follower. Here, we are told that Andrew was a disciple of John the Baptist's before he met Jesus.

41-42. He **first found his own brother Simon**, and said to him, **"We have found the Messiah"** (which is translated Christ). And he brought him to Jesus. Now when Jesus looked at him, He said, **"You are Simon the son of Jonah. You shall be called Cephas"** (which is translated a stone).

 Luke 9:20 "He (Jesus) said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Peter answered and said, 'The ______ of God.'"

Definition: "He FIRST found his own brother SIMON" - Andrew INTRODUCED his brother Simon to Jesus on this occasion, but Peter did not **make the DECISION to FOLLOW Jesus** and "forsake ALL" until later (see Luke 5:1-11). This is like a lot of us - we may KNOW JESUS as our Savior, but it may take a long time before **we really SURRENDER our lives** to Him completely.

Definition: "You shall be called CEPHAS" - "Cephas" is the Hebrew, the Greek is "Petros," meaning a **rock or stone**, and which we translate as PETER in English. Jesus is NOT naming Simon for any **rocklike quality** in his personality or character, because we see Peter as being VOLATILE, IMPETUOUS, WILD and UNSTABLE in the natural. Rather, Jesus is prophesying what Simon will be like IN THE FUTURE, when **he will be BORN AGAIN and FILLED with the HOLY SPIRIT**.

 Matthew 16:17-18 "Jesus answered and said to him, 'Blessed are you, ______ Bar-Jonah (son of Jonah), for flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but My Father who is in heaven. And I also say to you that you are ______, and on this ______ I will ______ My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail (be victorious) against it.'"

Definition: "On this ROCK I will build My CHURCH" - It is not Peter himself that the church is built upon, but the CONFESSION of his FAITH that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. In the Greek, this distinction is obvious, because Peter is "petros" a "little rock," and "on THIS ROCK," the word "petra" is used, meaning a large, solid rock.

43-45. The following day Jesus wanted to go to Galilee, and He found Philip and said to him, "Follow Me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found Him or whom Moses in the law, and also the prophets, wrote - **Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph**."

Matthew 13:55-56 "Is this not the ______ son? Is not His ______ called _____? And His ______ James, Joses, Simon and Judas? And His ______, are they not all with us? Where then did this Man get all these things?"

Definition: "Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph" - People in Bible times were known by the town they were from, and by their father's name. Of course, Jesus had grown up with people thinking Joseph was His father, and perhaps even the stigma of being thought to be illegitimate, since He was conceived BEFORE Joseph married Mary. Nathanael, at this point, does not know anything about Jesus' virgin birth. Also, please note that Mary and Joseph DID have other children after Jesus. Children born the NORMAL WAY (see Matthew 1:24-25), which contradicts the teaching of the Roman Catholic religion, which says that Mary remained a virgin all her life.

46-47. And Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward Him, and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no guile!"

Matthew 2:23 "And he came and dwelt in a city called ______, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets, 'He shall be called a ______.""

Definition: "ISRAELITE indeed, in whom there is NO GUILE" - Without guile means without deceitfulness or tricks, or in other words open and honest. God changed Jacob's name to Israel because the name **Jacob meant "one who schemes and cheats."** In the Old Testament, whenever God wanted to stress the **SINFULNESS of the nation of Israel**, He would call them by the old name, Jacob. Here, Jesus uses the term "Israelite" for Nathanael, because Nathanael was **open and honest about his doubts about Jesus**.

48-49. Nathanael said to Him, "How do You know me?" Jesus answered and said to him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." Nathanael answered and said, **"Rabbi, You are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!"**

Luke 1:31-35 "And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name ______. He will be great, and will be called the ______ of the ______; and the Lord God will give Him the ______ of His father (ancestor) David. And He will reign (rule) over the house of Jacob (Israel) forever, and of His ______ there will be no end." (Verse 35) "And the angel answered and said to her (Mary), 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the ______ of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the ______ of ____.'"

Definition: "You are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel" - Nathanael knew his Bible. He knew that the Messiah (the Anointed One) who was to come was referred to as the Son of God and the King of Israel in many of the Old Testament prophecies.

Read Psalm 2:1-12 (Verse 2) "The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, ______ the Lord and ______ His Anointed (the Christ, Messiah), saying, 'Let us break their bonds in pieces and cast away their cords from us.'" (Verse 6-7) "Yet I have set My ______ on My holy hill of Zion. I will declare the decree: the Lord has said to Me, 'You are My ______, today I have begotten You. Ask of Me, and I will give You the nations for Your inheritance.'" (Verse 12) "Kiss the ______, lest He be angry, and you perish in the way, when

Definition: "Nathanael" - Nathanael is his Hebrew name, and it means "given by God" or "gift of God." Later, when he is listed with the original twelve disciples of Jesus, he is listed by his **Greek name of Bartholomew**.

 Luke 6:13-16 "And when it was day, He called His ______ to Him; and from them He ______ twelve whom He also named ______: Simon, whom He also named ______, and Andrew his brother; James and John; Philip and ______; Matthew and Thomas; James the son of Alphaeus, and Simon called the Zealot; Judas the son of James, and Judas Iscariot who also became a traitor."

Definition: "I SAW YOU under the fig tree" - Nathanael's reaction to this statement shows that Jesus did more than just pass by and notice him sitting under a tree. The context indicates that Jesus saw more than just the outward man, but was able to read his inner character as well.
