Therefore, when the chief priests and officers saw Him, they cried out, saying, **"Crucify Him, crucify Him!"** Pilate said to them, "You take Him and crucify Him, for **I find no FAULT in Him**."

Luke 23:20-23 "_____, therefore, wishing to ______ Jesus, again called out to them. Definition: " I find no FAULT in Him" - Pilate could find no fault in Jesus, because there WAS no fault or sin of any kind in Him. Jesus was the absolutely sinless Son of God, and although He had a truly human body, and was tempted to sin as we are, He never gave in to the temptation and sinned.

Definition: "When He was REVILED, did not REVILE in RETURN" - Revile means to be verbally abusive or use abusive language. Jesus did NOT answer back, threaten or curse the soldiers who were abusing Him. Jesus knew that everything

that was happening was according to God's plan, and He committed Himself to the Father. God's word tells us that the way Jesus acted when He was suffering unjustly is **to be our EXAMPLE of how we are to react to abuse**, persecution and **unfair treatment** from others.

Definition: "Making Himself EQUAL with God." - Jesus was ABSOLUTELY RIGHT in making statements that claimed He was EQUAL with God, because He WAS God! He was God come to earth in the FLESH, having taken HUMAN FORM and BECOME a MAN. Jesus is given many titles for Himself in Scripture that belong only to God, such as "Alpha and Omega, the Beginning and the End, the First and the Last." Also, He receives WORSHIP from men and angels (see Rev. 5:5-14; Hebrews 1:6).

Definition: "When Pilate heard that saying, he was the MORE AFRAID" - Not only did Pilate have his own instincts and conscience warning him that Jesus was innocent, but his wife had a dream concerning Jesus, and she warned her husband not to be involved in the underhanded dealings of the Jewish leaders.

Definition: "YOU could have NO POWER at ALL AGAINST Me" - Pilate thought he had power over Jesus, but if he had known who Jesus really was, he never would have allowed the Jews to use him as their pawn, and he would have realized he had no power at all. Jesus knew that everything that was happening was according to God's plan, and NO ONE could hurt Him or mistreat Him unless the Father allowed it. Pilate and the Jewish leaders did NOT kill Jesus and TAKE His life - He GAVE His life for us on the cross. In fact, as far as God was concerned, Jesus had already paid for the sins of the world as "the Lamb who was SLAIN from the foundation of the world". This is a "mystery" in that we do not understand how time has no meaning to God, and how something that hasn't happened yet, humanly speaking, has "already happened" in the mind of God.

Definition: "I LAY IT DOWN of Myself" "I have POWER to TAKE IT AGAIN" - If Jesus had just said, "I lay down My life of Myself" we might say He just meant He was laying it down as an offering to God, just as any martyr could do. However, Jesus said He has the power to "take it up again" (come back to life), so we know He is talking about **something far greater than anything a mere human being could do**. He had the POWER to "yield (give) up His spirit" on the cross - **to release His spirit to the Father at the TIME that He CHOSE**. Most crucifixions took ALL DAY, if not DAYS, to kill the person, yet Jesus was dead within a few short hours. Even Pilate and the Roman soldiers were surprised that He was dead so soon.

 Mark 15:44 "Pilate marveled (was surprised) that He was ______ dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him if He had been ______ for some time."

12-15. From then on Pilate sought to release Him, but the Jews cried out, saying, "**If you let this man go, you are not Caesar's friend**. Whoever makes himself a king speaks against Caesar." When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he brought Jesus out and sat down in the judgment seat in a place that is called The Pavement, but in Hebrew, Gabbatha. Now it was the Preparation Day of the Passover, and about the sixth hour. And he said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" But they cried out, "Away with Him, away with Him! Crucify Him!" **Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?"** The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar!"

Matthew 27:24 "When ______ saw that he could not prevail at all, but rather that a tumult (riot) was rising, he took ______ and _____ his _____ before the multitude, saying, 'I am innocent of the blood of this just Person. You see to it.'"

Definition: "If you let this man go, you are not Caesar's friend" - The chief priests and Jewish leaders were threatening Pilate, **blackmailing him** into doing what they wanted, by saying that **he would be considered a TRAITOR** to Caesar, the Roman Emperor, if he treated Jesus as a king. Pilate wanted to let Jesus go, but he gave in to fear and political pressure from the Jews. He washed his hands in front of them all to symbolize the fact that he didn't want anything to do with their plot against Jesus.

16-18. So he delivered Him to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus and led him away. And He, bearing His cross, went out to a place called **the Place of a Skull, which is called in Hebrew, Golgotha**, where they crucified Him, and **two others with Him**, one on either side, and Jesus in the center.

Definition: "The Place of a SKULL, which is called in Hebrew, GOLGOTHA" -The hill outside Jerusalem that was shaped like a skull. The Latin for "skull" is calvarius, where we get the name **Calvary**. The Hebrew name is Golgotha, which also means skull. This area outside of the city was also the garbage heap for the people of Jerusalem, and was the place where executions were carried out.

Definition: "They CRUCIFIED Him, and TWO OTHERS with Him" - The other Gospel accounts tell us that two thieves were crucified with Jesus, and that they both reviled and insulted Him at first. Luke give us more insight into **one of the thieves who later cried out in faith to Jesus**. Jesus promised him that he would be with Him in Paradise that very day. The thief did not fully understand who Jesus was or what He was doing, but he acknowledged Him by recognizing that Jesus had done no wrong, and by calling him Lord (Romans 10:9-10).
