Jews wrapped each arm and leg separately, whereas Egyptian mummies have their arms and legs wrapped together with the body. Definition: "A NEW TOMB in which NO ONE had yet been laid" - The bodies of criminals who were executed by crucifixion were usually dumped in a common grave, or out at the "city dump" outside of town. Only a rich man, which Joseph of Arimathea was, could afford to have a brand new tomb in a garden, and only a believer in Jesus as Messiah would have given up his own tomb for Jesus' body to be buried in. God prophesied through Isaiah the prophet, 700 years before Christ, that the Messiah would be buried in a rich man's tomb. 20:1. On the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the STONE had been TAKEN AWAY from the tomb. Mark 16:1-4 "Now when the \_\_\_\_\_\_ was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome brought spices, that they might come and anoint Him.
