Definition: "She saw TWO ANGELS in WHITE - Luke calls them "two men in shining garments", but angels usually appear in the form of men. On some occasions, they appear exactly as normal men, but at other times, such as described in Revelation 10:1, they are quite glorious and shining, and definitely would not be confused with human beings.

Definition: "I do not know where they have laid Him" - Peter and John have looked in the empty tomb and believed that Jesus rose from the dead, but Mary seems to be still confused and unsure, because **she thinks someone has taken His body and laid it somewhere** other than in the tomb. We know that Peter and John RAN to the tomb, so perhaps Mary was walking slowly back, and she arrived at the tomb after Peter and John had already left.

14-16. Now when she had said this, **she turned around and saw Jesus standing there**, **and did NOT KNOW that it was JESUS.** Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" She, supposing Him to be the gardener, said to Him, "Sir, if You have carried Him away, tell me where You have laid Him, and I will take Him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to Him, "Rabboni!" (which is to say, Teacher).

Definition: "She turned around and SAW JESUS standing there" - John's account of the morning of Jesus' resurrection contains quite a few more details of what happened, than Matthew, Mark and Luke give us. Also, it seems to be from Mary Magdalene's perspective, which could also account for why John gives us different details. It would seem that Mary Magdalene came to the tomb ALONE "early, while it was still dark" (John 20:1), whereas the women as a GROUP came "when the sun had risen" (Mark 16:2). Mary went to get Peter and John

separately, before the women as a group went to tell all the disciples. Mary evidently saw Jesus in the garden alone, before any of the other women were there, although He appears to them as a group later. When Mary saw Jesus, **He told her not to hold onto Him**, but when the women as a group saw Him, He allowed them to hold Him by the feet.

Definition: "Did NOT KNOW that it was JESUS" - There have been different opinions of why Mary and the disciples didn't recognize Jesus right away after He rose from the dead. It could have been that Mary had her head down, was crying, and just did not look up before speaking, supposing Him to be the gardener. It could be that they just weren't expecting to see Jesus, and the last time they'd seen Him, His body was torn to shreds and covered with blood, so they didn't expect to see Him completely whole and restored. It could be that He looked slightly different in His resurrection body, because we know from God's word that our resurrection bodies will be perfect, and Jesus as a human being may have had some physical imperfections that were changed by His resurrection. In Luke 24:13-32, the disciples on the road to Emmaus did not recognize Jesus, and it says, "their eyes were restrained so that they did not know Him." Maybe it was part of God's plan to not have Jesus be recognized immediately in that instance.

Definition: "I have not yet ASCENDED to My Father" - Jesus is not speaking here of His ascension (going up) into heaven 10 days before Pentecost (Luke 24:51, Acts 1:9-11), but of a quick trip up to heaven immediately after His resurrection, in which He presented His blood before God, in order for God the Father to accept His sacrifice on our behalf. Jesus returned so quickly, that the other women encountered Him, and He let them cling to Him and hold Him, whereas**He would not allow Mary to do that before He went up to heaven**. He then remained on earth for 40 days, showing Himself to many of His disciples, until He went up to heaven to sit at the right hand of God the Father.

Definition: "I am ASCENDING to My Father and your Father" - In this short statement is contained almost the whole of the meaning of the Old Testament sacrifices, and the work of the High Priest in the Temple of Israel. Just as **the High Priest would go once a year** into the Holy of Holies to present the blood of the animal sacrifices on the Day of Atonement, Jesus went into the true Holy of Holies in heaven to present HIS OWN BLOOD on the mercy seat as a propitiation (atonement) for our sins. All the animal sacrifices and all the work of the priests of Israel was only for one purpose: to point to the work of Jesus Christ on the cross, and AFTER He shed His blood on the cross, when He ascended up to heaven to present His blood before God as the ultimate, supreme sacrifice for our sins.

Definition: "When the DOORS were SHUT...Jesus came and stood in the midst" - This is one of a number of Scriptures that describe what our resurrection bodies will be like, because God's word says we will "be like Him" in the resurrection (Romans 8:18-23, I John 3:2). The disciples were fearful of being arrested by the Jews, so they were hiding out in a locked room. Jesus appeared and stood in their midst without knocking on the door or entering through the door in the common way. Therefore, we assume that His resurrection body, as well as ours will be, was able to pass through solid objects.

Definition: "As the Father has SENT ME, I also SEND YOU" - How did the Father send Jesus? He sent Him "anointed with the Holy Spirit and power" and with "the Spirit of the Lord upon Him and ANOINTED to preach the gospel and set the captives free" (Acts 10:38, Luke 4:18). This is how Jesus will SEND US, His disciples, with the same anointing of the Holy Spirit and power (Acts 1:8, I John 2:20 & 27), in order to carry out the work of spreading the message of His gospel to all the world. He also said that "All authority had been given to Him in heaven and on earth" and THEREFORE (because of that) we should go out and preach the gospel and make disciples in His name. As disciples of Jesus Christ, we have the authority to use His name in prayer and spiritual warfare, and He has ALL AUTHORITY GIVEN to Him by the Father, and He sends us out under that authority.

Definition: "**RECEIVE the HOLY SPIRIT**" - Jesus was telling the disciples that they would be receiving the Holy Spirit very soon, on the Day of Pentecost. **By BREATHING on them, it was SYMBOLIC of the Holy Spirit** coming upon them, because the word for "breath" and "spirit" are the same. It reminds us also of when God BREATHED life into Adam - God had just made the physical body of man, and now **created man's spirit** by breathing into him.
