Definition: "Signifying by what DEATH he would GLORIFY God" - When Jesus says, "You will stretch out your hands, and another will gird you and carry you where you do not wish," He is referring to Peter being arrested and put in chains (girded, tied up), and led away to prison. History tells us that later in his life, Peter was arrested and put to death for his faith in Jesus Christ. Jesus told Peter that his death would GLORIFY GOD, and later Paul says in Philippians 1:19-20 that he wants his life to magnify (glorify) Christ, even if by his death. This means that those Christians who are martyred (killed) for their faith in Christ have a witness to others, even as they are dying, and God Himself receives the praise and glory.

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Definition: "But Lord, what about this man?" - Peter wanted to know what was going to happen to his best friend, John. Not so much in a way of just being concerned, but in a way of judging the fairness of what Jesus had planned for **Peter** as opposed to what He had planned for John. This is comparison of others and a form of judging, and it is sin. How often do we do this, too - compare ourselves to others? If we compare ourselves to someone we think is on a lower level spiritually, mentally, financially, or whatever, it makes us feel better about ourselves (in a sick sort of way). If we compare ourselves to someone we think is on a higher level than we are, it may make us discouraged, especially if we are comparing ourselves to their qualities that we cannot change in ourselves. The Bible tells us to "examine ourselves" (II Corinthians 13:5) and only to compare ourselves with ourselves, as far as spiritual growth or God's plan for our lives are concerned. God has an individual plan and purpose for each one of us, so don't make yourself miserable by trying to compare yourself to others and what God has planned for them. God has a plan and a purpose for your life, which He has planned even before you were born!
