Definition: “Who DESIRES LIFE, and loves MANY days, that he may SEE GOOD” – This is the same as what Jesus said He would give us when He said, **“That they may have LIFE, and have it MORE ABUNDANTLY.”** Jesus is NOT speaking about MATERIAL abundance or financial prosperity, but about SPIRITUAL blessings and abundance. God does promise to supply all our physical needs, but the most important things are the things of the Spirit, such blessings as forgiveness, eternal life in heaven, and a relationship with God Himself. Here is Psalm 34, we see a “formula” for having this abundant life, and it consists of several things, but **the bottom line is OBEDIENCE to GOD.**

Definition: “Keep your TONGUE from EVIL, and your lips from SPEAKING guile” – This is one of the steps or **parts of the formula for the abundant life** that God desires us to have. We **MUST** learn to control our mouth and the words that we say. We **MUST** turn away from all evil speaking, negative speaking, angry words and bitterness. A perverse mouth (Proverbs 8:13) is one of the things **GOD HATES!!** Perverse means “turned away from, or **opposing what is right or good; CORRUPT; improper, stubborn, obstinate.**”

Definition: “Do GOOD; seek PEACE” – This is another part of the “formula” for the good life that God would give to us. The opposite of peace is strife and bitterness. Bitterness hurts MANY MORE people than just the one who is bitter. Many family dysfunctions and generational sins begin as a ROOT of BITTERNESS in someone’s life, which then passes down to their families in the form of more DYSFUNCTIONS, ADDICTIONS, and other problems.

Definition: "The EYES of the Lord are on the RIGHTEOUS, and His EARS are OPEN to their CRY"

- The first prayer of an unsaved "sinner" that God hears is the prayer for SALVATION, when that sinner cries out to God to SAVE him from his sins. After a person ACCEPTS Jesus Christ as his or her Savior, that person is **NO LONGER** considered a "sinner" by God, but God sees that one as His son or daughter, and as "the righteousness of God in Christ Jesus" (II Corinthians 5:21).

Definition: "The Lord is NEAR to those who have a BROKEN HEART" - A BROKEN and a CONTRITE HEART or spirit is something that God will accept. **Contrite means having grief, remorse or deep sorrow for having done wrong, and especially sorrow for having offended God.** Isaiah 57:15 says, "For thus says the High and Exalted One who lives forever, whose name is Holy, 'I dwell on a high and holy place, and also with the **CONTRITE and lowly of spirit (humble)**, in order to revive the HEART of the contrite." If you want to have a close relationship with the Lord, and "dwell with Him in a high and holy place," you MUST come to a place where you **HUMBLE yourself before Him**, and weep and mourn for the awfulness of your sin. You must come to God with a broken heart, not with PRIDE and arrogance, or rationalizing your sins. **This MOURNING and WEEPING will NOT last forever, as God desires to "REVIVE the heart of the contrite" (the one who is sorry for their sins)**, and Jesus said He came to "HEAL the broken hearted." There is much JOY in the Christian life, but only after you have come to God with a broken and contrite spirit, draw NEAR to Him, and THEN He will lift you up (exalt you), heal you, and give you His joy.

19-22 Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but **the Lord DELIVERS him OUT of them ALL**. He guards all his bones; not one of them is broken. Evil shall slay the wicked, and those who hate the righteous shall be condemned. The Lord redeems the soul of His servants, and none of those who trust in Him shall be condemned.

Definition: “The Lord DELIVERS him OUT of them ALL” – God never promises that we will not have troubles, problems, trials and tribulations in life, but **He does promise that He will bring us through them all safely**. When Jesus says that He has “overcome the world,” part of the meaning in the original Greek is “I have deprived it of power to harm you.” The storm may be raging all around you, but you are SAFE in Jesus. **He has deprived that situation of whatever harm it might have done you**. You may think it is harming you while you’re going through it, but because God is causing ALL things to work together for your good, and to make you more like Christ (Romans 8:28-29), it is actually working for your eternal benefit, not harm. Because God is all-knowing, all-powerful, all-loving, and all-wise, we can TRUST HIM to know what He is doing when He ALLOWS certain things to happen in our lives. Does that include the “bad” things that happen in our lives that are the CONSEQUENCES of our own actions - our wrong choices and sins? Yes, the Lord loves us enough to even **work these things for our GOOD**, if we will let Him.
