Amazing Grace

What is God's grace all about? Grace means unmerited or UN-EARNED favor. God's grace is being accepted and loved by God when we have done NOTHING and CAN DO NOTHING to EARN or DESERVE it. In other words, you cannot earn your way to heaven by doing "good works". Monthly Evangelistic Outreach to Venice Beach

Saturday, April 6, 2024 - Our ministry teams today consisted of Tom, me, Sheldon, Felipe, Ricardo, Brian, Ulysses, David, Lalo, Victor and Keith. For the homeless, we had 180 lunches, hygiene/toiletry packets, socks, used clothing (including jackets, knit hats and shoes), some blankets, and dog food for those that have dogs. Felipe, Ricardo, Ulysses, Brian, and David went to the homeless encampments under various freeway overpasses in Santa Monica, West LA and Playa del Rey. Victor, Lalo and I went to the north end of the Venice Boardwalk, and Sheldon and Keith went to the South end of the Boardwalk, and Tom stayed home to provide prayer cover. We gave out all of the clothes and shoes, and all but a few lunches. The leftover lunches will be given out as we see people on the streets or parking lots in town. The people who got the blankets were very thankful, as it is still very cold at night. A man named Elliott was so happy to get a nice leather jacket, and all the people who got shoes were thrilled to get shoes that fit them. We saw Jean, who lives in her van and is almost 89 years old, and she got a lunch, a knit hat, some toiletries and a washcloth. I also had a large-print "Our Daily Bread" and crossword

puzzle book for her. We saw Kim, who gave me a big hug, and another man who was near her said he remembered me. They all got lunches, toiletries and some clothing. Sheldon said it was a real blessing today, and one guy was so happy to get a lunch, he asked, "Are you Jesus?" Sheldon said, "No, but I work for Him." Another young man named Kai said he knew about the Bible Tabernacle, and that he was looking for a church. A young couple in a tent asked if there was anyone coming that offered shelter, and he told them about the Bible Tabernacle. Felipe said they had an "incredible" time giving out everything, and people really needed the clothes and personal hygiene items especially. At one location, there was music playing, and David asked a homeless woman to dance with him. Of course, he also gave her a lunch, and to the other people there. There is a gospel tract in every lunch, and we also handed out tracts in English and Spanish to people who were just down on the Boardwalk enjoying the nice day.

To give an example of how we give out the leftover lunches, I went to the "99-Cent Store" and saw a bunch of homeless people by the parking lot. I went over and asked if anyone needed something to eat, and they looked at me kind of funny. Then, one guy, who was wrapped in a blanket, said, "Oh, yes, please!" and held out his hand, and I gave him a lunch. Then I guess the others realized what it was and they asked for lunches, too. I ended up giving out five lunches. Kaela said she gave out seven lunches to homeless people by the 7-Eleven near her house. Another time, I was at McDonald's, and there were five homeless guys outside, and they were all very happy to get lunches.

Saturday, May 4, 2024 - Our team members today were Tom, me, Felipe, Jose, David, Ricardo, Victor, Lalo and Keith. Tom stayed home to keep us covered in prayer, and Lalo and I went up to the north end of the Boardwalk. Victor and Keith went to the south end of the Boardwalk, and Felipe, Jose, David, and Ricardo went to the homeless encampments under the various freeway overpasses around West L.A. We did not see as many homeless people on the Boardwalk, so the city may have had a "sweep" and moved some of them off. I told Lalo we could look for homeless people along the side streets off of Lincoln Blvd., but when we got there, the whole street was closed off! Police were directing people to other streets, and Lalo said he could see a bunch of people up ahead on Lincoln. We didn't know what was happening, but we could not go where there were any homeless people, so Lalo and I had guite a few lunches left over. Later, we found out there was a Cinco de Mayo parade, and since we didn't see any parade at that time, they were probably just setting up and getting ready for it. Keith and Victor gave out all of their lunches, and we all gave out clothing, shoes, toiletry/hygiene packets, and also dog food for those with dogs. All the homeless people were thankful and happy to receive the food and other things for their physical comfort, and many of them were giving thanks to God, as it says in Second Corinthians 9:12-13, "For the administration of this service not only supplies the needs of the saints, but also is abounding through MANY THANKSGIVINGS to GOD, while through the proof of this ministry, they glorify God for the obedience of your confession to the gospel of Christ, and for your generous sharing with them and all men." Lalo and I saw Jean, who lives in her van, and she saw us before we got to her, and she came running out of her van (as fast as an 89-year-old can run) hollering, "Dottie, Dottie, over here!" She got a lunch, a towel and wash cloth, a knit hat, and some thick, warm socks. We asked one man if he wanted a pillow, and he said, "Oh, yes! I would love a pillow!" He also got a lunch and some clothing. Another man took a lunch and asked, "Are you the Christians?" We said "Yes," and he said, "You always have those little booklets inside," and we again said "Yes, we do." It didn't seem to keep him from taking a lunch, so praise the Lord! A man named Rishon had no shirt, and only a blanket around his shoulders. We gave him a lunch, two T-shirts, some socks and shoes, and he was full of smiles. He saw we had a roll of toilet paper, and asked if he could have that, also, so we gave it to him, and I gave him a big hug. One woman got a lunch and toiletries, and then she saw we had some personal wipes, and she was very happy to get a packet of wipes. Felipe, Jose, David, and Ricardo had a great time and gave out all of their lunches and clothing, and also reached homeless people along the streets and freeway entrances and exits. Some of the people were asking for money, but Felipe said,

"We gave them lunches instead of money, and a lot of them were terribly thirsty." All of our lunches contain a bottle of water, and each lunch contains a gospel tract for their spiritual thirst, as well.

"And Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life. He who comes to Me shall never hunger, and he who BELIEVES in Me shall never THIRST." (John 6:35) "And He said to me, 'It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. I will GIVE of the fountain of the WATER of life freely to him who THIRSTS." (Revelation 21:6)

Saturday, June 1, 2024 - God sent forth "laborers into the harvest" for us today, so besides Tom and me. we had Felipe, Ulysses, David, Sheldon, Kaela, Victor, and Christina. Felipe, Ulysses, and David went to various homeless groups in West L.A. and Venice, and also to a large group of homeless at Wilshire Blvd. and Bundy in the Ralph's parking lot and Staples parking lot. The city seems to be moving homeless people off of the Boardwalk, but these may be some of them, now just on the streets. We are blessed that Felipe and his group make the effort to find these ones scattered about the city. Felipe said these people were really surprised when his group pulled up and started offering them food and clothing. We find that many homeless people are surprised when we say we're there to help them, as they are more used to people wanting them to move somewhere else. Victor, Sheldon and I went to the north end of the Venice Boardwalk, and Kaela and Christina went to the south end. We had 182 lunches, lots of socks, used clothing, shoes, blankets and hygiene/toiletry packets for the homeless. Some of the homeless people seem to have nicknames, and we gave out food and clothing and blankets to "Boston", "Winter", and "Flower" and they were all very thankful. As we walked away from Flower, she said, "Oh, let's see what we have for lunch," and she tore open her bag. Another lady got a lunch, and she said, "Oh, thank you, I'm so hungry!" Sheldon gave a lunch to a man named Christian, and he also prayed with him. Christian confessed that he is an alcoholic, but he was glad to have Sheldon pray for him. After we finished at the Boardwalk, we drove up to the Whole Foods store, and Victor saw a homeless man, and gave him two lunches, because he seemed to be in really bad shape. As he was giving the man the lunches, a woman came out of the store and offered to buy the man coffee, but he asked for a soda instead, and she went in and got him a soda. We gave out a few more lunches there, also. This was Christina's first time going on the outreach, and she really liked it. We also handed out gospel tracts along the Boardwalk, in English, Spanish, and one in Korean. The Korean lady, one of the vendors, said her name is Esther, and she asked for a couple of lunches to give to homeless people if she saw someone in need. Felipe said, "We gave out all of the lunches and things with joy and pleasure." We all had a great time, and all the homeless people were very grateful and happy to get some things for their physical comfort, and every lunch has a gospel tract inside for their spiritual comfort.
